Also, since this is a themed weekend being at the historic Calico Ghost Town, it is encouraged to have every person attending wear theme appropriate attire while in camp (1880 era Wild West, no guns). We will be having costume contests for the youth AND the adults so go all out and have fun with the theme. ALL awards (except Chili Cook off) will be distributed on Sunday after the Calico Cattle Run Closeout.

I look forward to working with each and every one of you at this year’s Calico Cuboree!

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

These rules are the general framework around which this Cuboree will be operated. The Scout Oath, Law, and Outdoor Code are the guides for ALL behavior at this Cuboree. Packs or individuals who do not conform to this spirit will leave the Cuboree.

A registration fee of \$25.00 will be charged to cover the cost of Cuboree supplies, patches, and prizes for each scout. Adult scouters are \$15.00 each. All fees due must be paid in full upon check-in at camp. Registration Deadline is April 19, 2019.

There will be **NO PARKING OF ANY VEHICLES in the Cub Scout camping areas. All vehicles will be parked (except designated emergency vehicles) in lower parking area.

**Campsites will be assigned by the Program Director. Each Pack will be required to use the minimal space for its campsite. All packs are required to exercise "low-impact" camping techniques. Administrative and Program Staff will dismiss packs from campsites upon check out.

**Packs and/or individuals should not plan on arriving to the Cuboree before 3:00 p.m. Friday. Campsites will not be assigned prior to this time.

**Participation/Event lanyards must be worn at all times at the event. Lanyards are to provide each scout/unit their designated times for morning and afternoon events.

**EACH person attending is to follow the Leave No Trace Principles throughout the camping weekend.

**Each scout needs to be reminded of the Buddy System if they are to leave the designated area to use the restroom or anywhere else for that matter.

**Be respectful of each other. Remember that words hurt.

**Be respectful of each family's camping area. **Scouts are NOT to enter another family's tent unless permission by the parent(s) is given.

**No cooking, bbq's or individual campfires in tent area unless otherwise designated.

**No alcohol what-so-ever during camping weekend.

**No smoking in camp area. Designated smoking area will be away from camp.

**No climbing or digging in the hillside during the scout weekend (this does not pertain to entertainment throughout designated times for specified guests).

**No one is to leave the campground area unless permission is given to do so or the time permits on the itinerary for family time. If a need arises to leave due to an emergency, please locate Heidi Battaglia, Camp Director at 760-217-7805 so that they are aware of the situation.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

**Please take time to say hi to other families you may not know. This is a PACK TEAM BUILDING weekend so be open to working together.

**If you see someone in need of help, in need of assistance of any kind, please be COURTEOUS and lend a hand.

**Parents, as night-time approaches and time for lights out, PLEASE make sure to keep the talk in the tents to a low minimum to be respectful of those that are trying to sleep around you.

**Technology: Phones, hand-held games, tablets, etc, should not be used during this camping weekend (exception - we have Super Scouts (special needs scouts) that need this type stimulation to control anxiety and/or meltdowns, SO, if the need arises for your scout to have this type time-out, please send them to your tent so that they are not followed by other scouts or become a distraction).

**Please be respectful of props, facades, and photo opportunity booths.

**Parents: this is a family campout with lots of bonding time so please keep the phone use to a minimum unless taking pictures.

**All campfire skits, songs, etc., must conform to Scouting standards, and must be submitted to the Program Director upon check-in. Those with the best descriptions/scripts will be chosen for the Saturday night Campfire show.

**Any two-way radios in use MUST NOT operate or interfere with the same channel as the Cuboree or Camporee staff. We need clear uninterrupted communication for emergency use. Your cooperation in this is greatly appreciated. The channel for the staff will be distributed at the Friday night meeting.

**Unit leaders are responsible for the supervision of their units at all times. Remember two deep leadership is required at all times. Please enforce safety and discipline.

**Understand that the purchase of, possession of, or consumption of any alcoholic beverages, illicit drugs, or firearms by a youth or adult at Cuboree will not be permitted and will result in immediate dismissal from Camporee.

CHECK-IN:

Units should not plan to arrive at the Cuboree site before 3:00 p.m. on Friday. Please have the following information available at check in:

- A unit roster of scouts and adults with addresses and phone numbers.
- Pre-registration fee receipt and any balance owed.
- Health Forms Medical A & B (will remain with unit) for pack members and participating adults including staff.
- Medical Authorization (Permission Forms) for treatment signed by parent / guardian.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

FIRST AID:

First Aid will be available at all times at the First Aid Tent. Units should have adequate first-aid supplies as part of their unit's equipment. All injuries, even if treated at the unit level, are to be reported to the First Aid Tent in a timely manner.

PACK/UNIT

- Flag (Pack)
- Bundle of wood for Saturday night Campfire
- First Aid Kit
- Shelters
- And any other items that your pack would bring while camping
- Kitchen set-up. Meals for unit (Each unit responsible for own food and meals, as well as chili cook off prep)



PERSONAL (Campers)

- Clothes (appropriate for the weather)
- Tent (or share) **METAL TENT STAKES!!** Calico grounds are extremely hard.
- Rope for tent just in case of high winds in the evening.
- Toilet Articles (Towels, Tooth Brush, Tooth Paste, Soap, Shampoo, etc.)
- Sleeping Gear (appropriate for the weather)
- Compass
- Poncho
- Water Bottle (STAY HYDRATED)
- Camp Chair
- And any other items that you would bring and need while camping

IF NOTHING ELSE, READ THIS!!

Check-in time is **from 3pm-9pm. Do NOT arrive earlier.

For those that are tent camping, please **bring thicker metal stakes because Calico ground is VERY hard and the thin metal stakes that the tents come with, as well as plastic stakes are subject to break easily. **Bring ROPE** as well just in case of strong winds.

Each family is encouraged to **bring 1+ bundle of wood for Saturday night campfire. If there is enough wood collected, we will have a campfire on Friday night as well. **NO** individual campfires.

Each Pack is responsible for their **own meals and Cracker Barrel each day. As a family, please bring extra snacks and any dietary needs that you need to be as comfortable as possible.

Calico can get very hot so please **bring a hand-held water bottle or hydration pack for each person attending. Water will be available throughout camp (do not drink tap water from the Calico area).

****Wear comfortable shoes**, like tennis shoes, hiking boots or cowboy boots. **NO sandals or open-toed shoes!!!** Ground is hard, dirty and many critters.

Don't forget **sunscreen. Even if the skies are overcast, the rays are sure to find you!!

****NO PARKING OF ANY VEHICLES IN CAMP SITE -NO EXCEPTIONS** (unless part of staff and/or props). Designated parking is in lower area of Calico grounds. Drop off of camping gear and supplies at designated camp area is permitted but cars must be moved immediately.

****Wild West / Western COSTUMES** (1880 era) encouraged for all scouts, leaders, parents and guests!!! Sheriff badges will be provided for all scouts and siblings and is included in price paid for event. Sorry, but **NO GUNS!!!** This is a touchy area for Calico so only select staff will be wearing toy guns. There will be a costume parade and contest.

You **MUST adhere to the activity schedules your scout is given which is shown on each individual lanyard as well as your welcome folder. This is **IMPERITIVE** because of the number of stations and number of scouts attending Cuboree. You **CANNOT** leave the station early and go to another station of your choice. All staff will have schedules and names of each participant for each time period.

****Medical forms (A & B)** for each PERSON attending must be turned into each Pack representative BEFORE event day in case of emergency. Medical forms will be checked and returned to each unit to keep during event.

****NO ALCOHOL WHAT-SO-EVER** to be brought to camp grounds as well as **NO SMOKING**. Designated areas for smoking will be identified away from camping area.

RULES FOR CUBOREE ACTIVITIES

FRIDAY ACTIVITIES 4:00pm~8:00pm

Two separate activities will be held Friday evening for all scouts and siblings to attend at their leisure, either while family is setting up their tents or when camp set-up is complete. Scouts and siblings can attend as individuals or with their unit.

First Aid Kits will be held in the First Aid Tent. First Aid Kits are to be worn throughout the entire weekend.

Calico Coloring Books will be located in the 'Calming' Tent (next to the First Aid Tent).

FIRST SESSION 9:40am~12:30pm & SECOND SESSION 4:00pm~5:30pm

All scouts/siblings will receive a lanyard in their welcome folder. This lanyard is to be worn ALL Saturday. Event times will be featured on the lanyard so that each scout/parent/leader knows where to report to each station and at what times.

YOU **MUST** adhere to the stations listed and times listed. There will be **NO EXCEPTIONS** to this rule due to the increased number of participants attending this years Cuboree.

Each Staff working each station will have names of EVERY scout/sibling that is to be at their stations during the scheduled times. If you arrive at a station that you are not on the list, you **MUST** find the correct station. Staff will not have time to direct you where to go. If your scout loses their lanyard, each FAMILY, please refer back to your welcome folder for the copy of the schedule stapled inside.

First Session activities are fun, hands-on, learning based activities. Most are theme related to the Calico era. Scouts will receive instruction from staff that is knowledgeable in their station.

Second session activities are fun-filled skills based activities. Each activity will be done with teams racing against one another for fun.

WESTERN COSTUME CONTEST FOR ALL

Western costumes are encouraged for ALL in attendance of the Cuboree – from the youngest to the oldest. Calico Ghost Town was once a booming town in the 1880's, so this era is preferred but open to all western wear. You can be as creative as you prefer – from truly authentic wear to as crazy western get-up you can find. Have fun with the theme. **NO GUNS WHATSOEVER** ONLY Staff may wear certain type toy guns with the approval of Calico Grounds prior to event.

Judging: A panel of judges will be roaming the grounds during FIRST SESSION ACTIVITIES and may come to you asking your name for a certain category of their choosing.

Awards for costume contest will be given directly after the Calico Cattle Run Closeout on Sunday.

RULES FOR CUBOREE ACTIVITIES

CHILI COOK-OFF

Chili Cook Off is open to adult individuals, families, dens, and/or units as a whole for entry. Be creative as you like with your chili. The more entries the better.

NAME YOUR CHILI with a sign NO LARGER than 8 ½” x 11” made to Western theme for a special award.

DO NOT add your personal name or unit information to what can be viewed. Place this information on the backside of your sign.

Your chili will receive a number and judges will be only viewing numbers for categories.

Chili can be prepared at event using the freshest of ingredients, or can be made previously and brought to event to be heated up. Please make a label for your chili stating ingredients used (for allergy purposes and judging categories).

All sampling utensils and cups provided by Cuboree.



CAMPFIRE PROGRAM SATURDAY EVENING 7:00pm-8:30pm

Campfire Program will consist of both Cuboree and Camporee participants.

Campfire will take place on Cuboree side at designated firepit.

All participants are to bring own chairs.

Awards for Cuboree Chili Cook Off to be presented during Campfire Program.

Skits, songs, etc., must conform to Scouting standards, and must be submitted to the Camp Director upon check-in. Those with the best description/scripts will be chosen (time permitting) for the Saturday night Campfire Program.

CALICO CATTLE RUN CLOSEOUT SUNDAY 8:30am-10:00am

Scouts and siblings will closeout the weekend with a Calico Cattle Run. Scouts will be encouraged to bring their previously made pool noodle ponies and report to the activity station area. Scouts will prepare their cows, grab their ponies and lead their cows to be corralled – all led by Calico Sheriff Gary. Fun Fun Fun!!

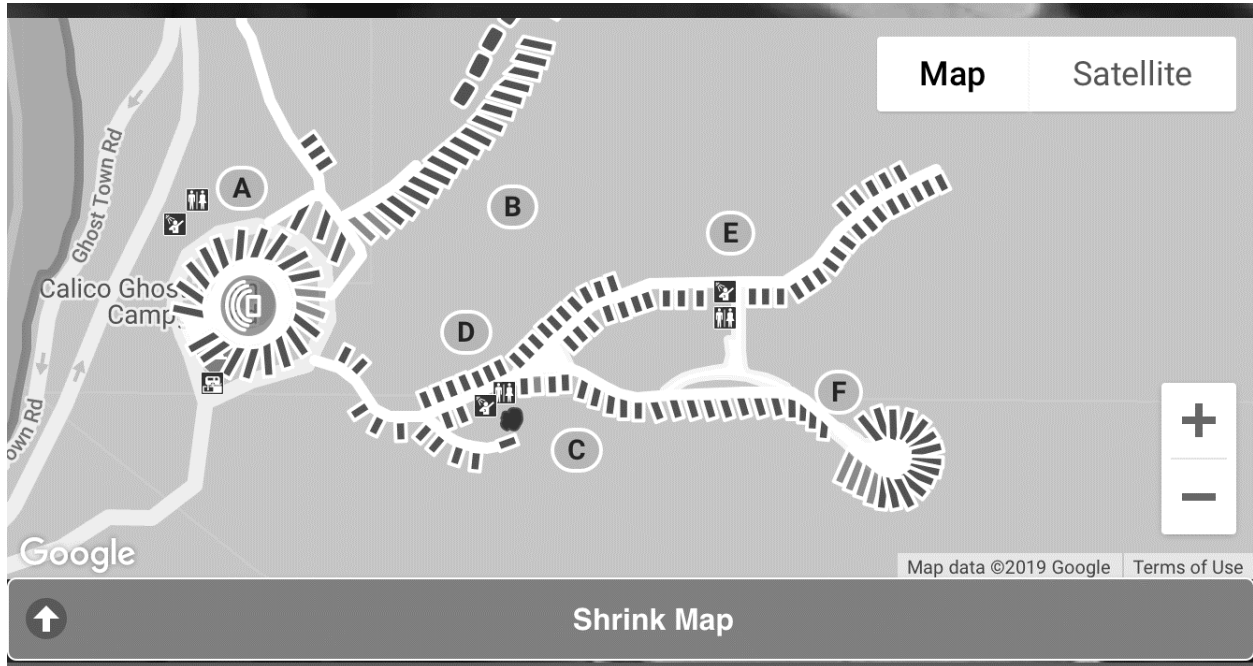
