TROOP ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS

THESE ACTIVITIES ARE HOSTED BY Troops. We hope to have at least 16 Troop hosted activities. The final number of activities and which activities are offered depend on the Troops attending. Larger units are encouraged to host more than one activity.

Remember the purpose of Webelosree is to show Webelos what Scouts do and how much fun it is to be a Boy Scout. Activities should be games or contests Scouts actually do at meetings or on outings. The activity **MUST BE HANDS ON** and should take a maximum of 25-30 minutes, teach skill if necessary, and complete race/game. Troops should be prepared to have as many as 20 Webelos doing the event at one time.

<u>ACTIVITIES WE REALLY WANT:</u>

We were hoping that several of the Troops could host events that could cover some of the requirements for certain Webelos Activity Badges.

POPULAR ACTIVITIES:

Bread on a stick, Disability Awareness, Pancake Toss, Atomic Relay, Stretcher Relay, Knots Relay

COMMUNICATIONS:

10-4 Codes, Signaling flags, Morse code, Football Signals, Messenger Drills, Sign Language.

FIRST AID:

Transportation Relays (carries, stretchers), Skill Courses (cut, burn, nosebleed, sunburn), Hurry Cases Drill, Poison Relay, (May use Ready-man requirements to design game.)

NATURE:

Plant ID Game, Tree ID Game, Stalking Trail, Trail Sign Course, Poisonous Plants Search, Nature Trail, L-N-T-(Erosion), What is it?

PHYSICAL FITNESS:

Obstacle Course, Spider's Web, Fitness Test, The Struggles, Wrist Pushing, Feet wrestling, Indian Leg Wrestling, Straight Back, Tournaments, Kneel to you Superior, Deliver the message, Grasshopper Race, 3 Legged Plus Race, Tin Can Relay, wheelbarrow Race, Sack Relay Race.

SCOUT SKILLS:

Knot Relay, Camp Gadgetry (tripod, simple flagpole, etc.), Rescue Throw Relay, Whipping, Rope Lift (rope block and tackle), How High Is It?, Friction Bridge, Trent Pitch Race, Scout Law Relay.

POSSIBLE ACTIVITY BADGES:

Citizen, Ready-man, Engineer, Scientist, Forester, Outdoorsman (All of these would have Pre-Requisites)

POSSIBLE BELT LOOPS & OR PINS:

Citizenship, Map & Compass, Wildlife Conservation, Disabilities Awareness (Some might have Pre-Requisites)
