Degree Programs

Associates Degree – Ideal for First year Scouters

- Current Registered and YPT Current
- Have your position specific training complete
- Attend University and take 3 classes

Bachelor's Degree – Ideal newer scouters and dedicated leaders

• Scouter must have earned the Associates degree

- Take 2 additional classes (5 total)
- Attend 2 Roundtables

Master's Degree - Ideal for involved Scouters looking to further their involvement and leadership

- Scouters must have earned a University of Scouting Bachelor's degree.
- Take 3 additional classes (8 total)
- 2 online national training classes (Hazardous weather, Safe Swim Defense, Trek Safely, climb On Safely, Safety Afloat)
- Lead one Unit Level outing, training, or meeting (virtual or In-Person)
- Earn one Adult Knot and/or commit to attending Wood Badge

<u>Doctorate Degree</u> – Ideal for strong seasoned leaders

- Scouters must have earned a University of Scouting Master's degree.
- Take 4 additional classes (12 total)
- Scouters must have earned their Wood Badge beads
- Lead one additional (2 total) Unit Level outing, training, or meeting (virtual or In-Person)
- Attend a District meeting /Staff a district event or serve as a unit commissioner
